Guidelines for Submission

Published semiannually, the *Missionary Mobilization Journal* produces practical and theoretical articles related to missions mobilization within the context of the missionary, church, agency, and academy, to equip and educate these stakeholders in the ministry of missionary mobilization. This journal is available free of charge in digital format.

The Vision

The goal of the *Missionary Mobilization Journal* is to provide relevant articles for missionaries, pastors, educators, mobilizers, students, and other missions-minded stakeholders. This is not an academic, peer reviewed journal. Rather, the purpose is to provide reputable content including best practices, trends and issues, and other concepts relevant to missions mobilization.

Criteria for Submitted Articles

- Submissions should be a resource that helps pastors, missionaries, and mobilizers send and sustain more missionaries.
- Articles must be of original content. They must have never been published elsewhere, unless permission
 is granted by the publisher, author, and The Center for Missionary Mobilization & Retention, and any other
 relevant stakeholders.
- Submissions must never be content that belittles a person or organization in any way.
- Content must never be plagiarized or copied from other individuals/institutions.

Parameters for Submitted Articles

- Length: 2,000-3,000 words. If a submission is over 3,000 words it may be revised by the editors of the *Missionary Mobilization Journal*.
- Articles must be submitted as a .doc or .docx file. If a file is not submitted in this format, the editors of the *Missionary Mobilization Journal* will request a new submission.
- Footnotes should be *Chicago Style*. Footnotes should be inserted at the bottom of each page, with a bibliography at the end of the article.

- Attach your article as a .doc or .docx file and include a short bio.
- If you would like to submit an image or graphic to accommodate your article, please ask for the specs from our editorial team.
